








# MAPS

# History LIVES HERE

---

## SUSANNA MOODIE'S TIME IN BELLEVILLE

Famous English-born Canadian author Susanna Moodie was a prominent writer in Canadian literary history. She wrote two of her most famous books during the time she lived in Belleville – both of which are still printed and available for purchase today.

**B**orn in England in 1803, Susanna Moodie immigrated to Upper Canada with her husband John Wedderburn Dunbar Moodie in 1832. They farmed near Cobourg for two years and then moved to the wooded Rice Lake before settling in the more urban environment of Belleville in 1840.

Susanna and John were two prominent Belleville writers in the mid-19th century. While John was better known as the sheriff of Victoria District

and later Hastings County, he assisted Susanna in her writing, wrote his own book and contributed essays to literary magazines. In the spirit of the times, they were dabblers in the occult, attending seances and attempting to communicate with the departed.

A member of a noted literary family, she became a leading author of the pre-Confederation period and her poems and short stories appeared in journals in Canada

and England. Her two famous autobiographical books, *Roughing It in the Bush* (1852) and *Life in the Clearings* (1853), have become Canadian literary classics.

The beautiful stone cottage once occupied by the Moodies, now a designated heritage site, is located at the corner of Bridge and Sinclair Streets, marked by a historical plaque. The home has stood the test of time and has been beautifully preserved.







# Heritage Sites

---

Enjoy our self-guided tours; each offering a glimpse into the heritage of Belleville. It's the perfect way to explore the sights of our historic city and learn about it firsthand.



Immerse yourself in Belleville's history and heritage through the Designated Historic Sites Walking Tour. Belleville's rich history dates back to early 18th century settlements. Captain John Walden Meyers, one of the 50 United Empire Loyalists who settled here in 1789 is a key historic figure. He built a dam across the Moira River and Meyers Mill, among many other contributions to the landscape of our city. The descendants of these Loyalists built many notable structures in Belleville's East Hill and Downtown District. There are 34 properties including homes, churches, a train station and parks that you can discover on this self-guided tour. ## GET INTO THE GROOVE

Porchfest is a celebration of music and a community tradition in Belleville's East Hill. Area residents set their best foot forward singing on front porches with an audience that moves from home to home, often joining the chorus. Organized by the Rotary Club of Belleville during the fall, this tradition is popular among the local community and is a seasonal favourite. Porchfest has been a roaring success for 12 years as residents sing their hearts out to a fervent audience dancing their way down the streets of East Hill.



Various businesses and organizations in the city help add flavour to the event with food and shopping specials.

Porchfest features hundreds of live musicians, singers and performers, charming the audience with their musical acts. Streets in East Hill are flooded with

families, groups of friends and tourists enjoying a melodious fall day in our friendly city. As you listen to these talented artists and locals, you can grab a bite to eat at Downtown Belleville's restaurants, cafes and eateries. You can also stop by some local stores and the **Side Hustle Market** to pick up interesting finds you may come across on your musical stroll. The event is followed by **The Porchfest After Party** in The Downtown District, with food and drink often added to the mix. This event displays the vibrant culture of Belleville and the spirit of the city.

# THE GALLERY DISTRICT

Interspersed along Front, Bridge and Pinnacle streets (think of a horseshoe), you'll find what has affectionately become known as 'the Gallery District'. A collection of beautiful and accessible galleries within easy walking distance in the **Downtown District**.



One can feel the soul of a community through its Gallery District. Words used to describe ours: vibrant, eclectic, exciting, inviting and accessible. The galleries have worked for decades offering varied perspectives which all tell wonderful and complex stories of our region, artists and community. Downtown art walks, outdoor festivals and events, cultural practices – are just a few of the examples of the many inspiring experiences the art community has to offer.



Explore our art scene by visiting the **Belleville Art Association (BAA)**, **Quinte Arts Council (QAC)**, **Gallery 121**, and

**the John M. Parrott Gallery** on the 3rd floor of the library. You can visit four different places within a short walk of each other and get an understanding of what each place is and does. Each is unique, has its own history and its own vibe. You immediately sense the creative energy in each space, both from the art on the walls and the work being done behind-the-scenes.


## DOWN BY THE BAY

**T**ake in the beautiful sights of the Bay of Quinte along the **Kiwanis Bayshore Trail**. Along this 2.75 km trail, you'll find public washrooms, a playground, a seasonal canteen, two boat launches and **Meyers Pier**. The **Zwick's Trail** is a 3.25 km paved trail that will take you to picnic areas, playgrounds, groomed sports fields and the **Quinte Dog Park**.



## ALONG THE RIVER

**S**troll the banks of the Moira River along the **Parrott Riverfront Trail** with 1.6 km of paved trail that skirts the edge of the **Downtown District**. Continue up to the **Riverside Park Trail**, where the 5.25 km paved trail passes by the **Kiwanis Skate Park**, a children's splash pad and playground, sports fields and public restrooms.
