

Getting Here & Around



Wherever you're going – we'll get you there! Belleville has three exits off Highway 401 and plenty of options to get you where you need to be while you explore.

By Train

The Via Rail Station is a short distance from Belleville's Downtown District, Quinte Sports and Wellness Centre and hotels, providing visitors with convenient rail service.



By Bus

Visit us from anywhere across Canada. The Megabus terminal stop is located at 169 Pinnacle St. - take advantage of the Belleville transit system once you arrive.

By Boat

Connie Carson: Full Circle Moment

In 1957, a special movie day took place at the McCarthy Theatre in Belleville. The Coca-Cola Company was hosting a marketing campaign giving kids under 14 a small bottle of pop and a free movie pass. This event occurred during my birthday week, on a cold, slushy Saturday in late February.

Dressed in a long green coat, white earmuffs and warm winter boots, a reporter for The Intelligencer snapped my photo with the Coca-Cola mascot as I lined up for the show.

Fast forward 50 years to 2003, and I am sitting in my favourite booth at the new Cafe E Restaurant, a few doors from where McCarthy Theatre used to be. I noticed a photo of the McCarthy Theatre showing a massive gang of kids waiting in a lineup. Upon closer inspection, I spotted myself in the crowd with my fluffy white earmuffs, green winter coat and all!

It was a strange and weird feeling to come full circle and end up six decades later in the same spot.


Stop & Smell the Roses

Start your tour at West Zwick's Park to get a great shot of the **Bay** Bridge. Before its construction, a paddle-wheel ferry powered by horses on a treadmill was used by farmers to bring produce across the bay to the Belleville market.

Stroll through beds of over 2.000 roses, perennials, annual flowers and a lovely fountain at the Corby Rose Garden (220 Ann St.) donated to the City by the Corby family in 1905. The garden has become a peaceful refuge in the middle of a growing city.

Take a short drive to a prominent landmark in the downtown core: the Belleville Armoury. Constructed in 1908. the Armoury is home to the Hastings and Prince Edward Regiment, the Regimental Museum, and is a recognized federal heritage building.





When asked what they love about this city, locals often talk about its water and trails. Belleville is a destination for outdoor enthusiasts.



Walk along the shores of the Moira River, where pioneers once built log homes, a trading post, an inn and the city's majestic City Hall in 1872.




A Historic Riverfront

Start your tour at the upper bridge, built in the 1930s as a Great Depression work project, and continue along Front Street. Keep an eye out for about a dozen brass historical plaques along the way.

Picture the mouth of the river jammed with up to 100,000 logs every spring and a dozen sawmills ringing out across the bay.

Finally, as you reach the pier, picture the powerful boats of the rum-runners, loaded to the gunnels with cases of whiskey, awaiting darkness to make their nefarious run to the U.S. shores.

This festival has been named one of the Top 100 Festivals and Events in Ontario (FEO) yearly since 2015.

Belleville's **Diwali** celebration began in 2021 and won Best New Festival (with a budget under \$100,000) at the FEO "Celebrate" Conference. Diwali is India's most important festival of the year and Belleville's South Asian community has brought the celebration to our City.

The Santa Claus Parade

celebrates the arrival of the holiday season on the third Sunday in November and features over 70 decorated floats winding their way along Bridge Street to the delight of cheering crowds.
